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A NOTE ABOUT INCLUSIVE LANGUAGE

You will hear Mother Diana using female pronouns for God, when the bulletin has printed in it the traditional all male language. This is to provide a balance, and to invite us all into the understanding that God is not a boy's name – God is both and neither female or male – we are all made in God's image – women and men. You may, as you feel called, use the female language too.

ABOUT LENT IN THE CHURCH

Lent is a time of returning home. It is when we, as Christians, slow down, reflect, pray, and remove from our lives things that distract us from who we are, and pull us from our relationship with God. In places of worship, we return to simplicity and stillness. Our music is tempered and we do not sing the Gloria nor say or sing any Alleluias. Our flowers are removed, the crosses are covered, and no blessing is given at the end of the service. Silver and gold chalices and patens that are normally used to hold the sacraments are replaced with those made of more humble materials. All of this is to remind us of what is important. That what is in the cup, not what the cup is made of, should be the focus of our lives. That the journey to Jerusalem which we take in Lent is one that will change us and the world, and we need to have a chance to stop for a moment the craziness of our lives to enter into a fullness of relationship with one another and with God. It is a time of renewal, reflection, and return. As Barbara Brown Taylor once said, we have these "forty days to cleanse the system and open the eyes to what remains when all comfort is gone. Forty days to remember what it is like to live by the grace of God alone and not by what we can supply for ourselves." And in some real sense, forty days to consider what tempts us. We are glad you have chosen to walk this journey of Lent here at Christ Church.

MINISTRY (Book of Common Prayer, p. 855, adapt.)

Celebrant Each week, as part of our Lenten preparation, we are reviewing the

teaching of the Church. Today, we are focused on ministry.

Celebrant Who are the ministers of the church?

People The ministers of the Church are lay persons, bishops, priests, and

deacons.

Celebrant What is the ministry of the laity?

People The ministry of lay persons is to represent Christ and his Church;

to bear witness to him wherever they may be; and, according to the gifts given them, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take their place in the life, worship, and

governance of the Church.

Celebrant What is the ministry of a bishop?

People The ministry of a bishop is to represent Christ and his Church,

particularly as apostle, chief priest, and pastor of a diocese; to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the whole Church; to proclaim the Word of God; to act in Christ's name for the reconciliation of the world and the building up of the Church;

and to ordain others to continue Christ's ministry.

Celebrant What is the ministry of a priest or presbyter?

People The ministry of a priest is to represent Christ and his Church, particularly as pastor to the people; to share with the bishop in

the overseeing of the Church; to proclaim the Gospel; to administer the sacraments; and to bless and declare pardon in the

name of God.

Celebrant What is the ministry of a deacon?

People The ministry of a deacon is to represent Christ and his Church, particularly as a servant of those in need; and to assist bishops

and priests in the proclamation of the Gospel and the

administration of the sacraments.

Celebrant What is the duty of all Christians?

People The duty of all Christians is to follow Christ; to come together

week by week for corporate worship; and to work, pray, and give for so that others might come into the fullness of life in

relationship with God; and to walk in love as Christ loved us.



Gracious God, whose blessed Son Jesus Christ came down from heaven to be the true bread which gives life to the world: Evermore give us this bread, that he may live in us, and we in him; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING Numbers 21:4-9

Lector The first reading is from the book of Numbers.

From Mount Hor the Israelites set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Lector Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Thanks be to God.

PSALM 107: 1-3, 17-22 (St. Helena Psalter)

Lector We will say the appointed Psalm responsively by full verse with the congregation saying the verses printed in bold.

We give you thanks, O God, for you are good; * your mercy endures for ever.

Let all those whom you have redeemed proclaim * that you redeemed them from the hand of the foe.

You gathered them out of the lands; * from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.

Some were fools and took to rebellious ways; * they were afflicted because of their sins.

They abhorred all manner of food * and drew near to death's door.

Then they cried to you in their trouble, * and you delivered them from their distress.

You sent forth your word and healed them * and saved them from the grave.

Let them give thanks to you for your mercy * and the wonders you do for your children.

Let them offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving * and tell of your acts with shouts of joy.

SECOND READING

EPHESIANS 2:1-10

Lector The second reading is a letter to the Ephesians.

You were dead through the trespasses and sins in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else. But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ-- by grace you have been saved-- and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God-- not the result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.

Lector Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People Thanks be to God

THE HOLY GOSPEL JOHN 3:14-21

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to John.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus said, "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God."

SILENCE FOR REFLECTION

THE CREED (Enriching Our Worship, p. 53)

Note the change in the wording, most especially with regard to the Holy Spirit. These are not errors in the bulletin, but are part of our rich liturgical heritage. The wording about the procession of the Holy Spirit is part of the difference in the Eastern and Western Churches, and a source of controversy. In fact, at our 71st General Convention, it was decided to remove the words "and the Son."

Let us stand together with Christians throughout the centuries and proclaim the basic creed of the church:

- We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.
- We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.
- We believe in the Holy Spirit, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. Who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified. Who has spoken through the prophets.
- We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Remain standing, as able, as we share in offering the Prayers of the People.

People Your mercy is great.

Leader Righteous God, your love liberates. We give thanks for those who courageously witness to your liberating love. Free all people from the evils of racism, religious strife, and hatred. We pray now for our neighborhoods of Bloomfield and Glen Ridge. Hear us, O God.

People Your mercy is great.

Leader Merciful God, your love heals. Care tenderly for all whose loved ones perished from pandemic disease in every nation. Strengthen health care workers, first responders, and caregivers. Relieve all who live with chronic illness and pain. We pray now for those on our parish prayer list. Hear us, O God.

People Your mercy is great.

Leader Incarnate God, your love enlightens. Open our hearts and minds to fresh understandings of our faith. Deepen our love for you and for one another. Teach us to pray for our enemies. Hear us, O God.

People Your mercy is great.

Leader Abiding God, your love saves. Those who died in the faith are made alive in Christ. We give thanks for your promise that we also will be raised to newness of life. Hear us, O God.

People Your mercy is great.

Celebrant I invite you now to offer your own intercessions or thanksgivings, either silently or aloud.





The Celebrant continues (Eucharistic Prayer A, Book of Common Prayer, p. 361)

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant and People:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**





HAVE FUN & LEARN SIGN LANGUAGE


Have you noticed that our sermons are being signed by parishioner Ann Watson?
